### **Tax Relief Programs**

New Fairfield offers tax relief programs for elderly and disabled homeowners. Applications are accepted from February 1 to May 15, 2025, at the Assessor's Office. To qualify for the State Program, applicants must be 65 or older by December 31, 2024, or fully disabled under Social Security, own their home as of October 1, 2024, and meet income limits (\$45,200 for single applicants, \$55,100 for married couples). The Town Program has higher income limits (\$61,343 single, \$74,482 married) but follows the same rules. Applicants must provide a 2024 tax return and Social Security 1099 forms or other proof of income.

A **Deferral Program** is also available for those who qualify by income. This allows homeowners to delay paying up to 50% of their remaining taxes, but the deferred amount must be paid back later. Applications and more details are available on the **Town website (Assessor's Department)**, or you can call 203-312-5625 for help.

#### Senior Medicare Patrol Alerts us to **Medicare fraud**, **errors**, **and abuse**

Trevor Reeves visited the senior center to educate seniors about the **Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP)** and how to prevent **Medicare fraud**, **errors**, **and abuse**. He explained that SMP helps Medicare beneficiaries **detect and report fraud**, protecting both individuals and the integrity of the Medicare program. The presentation covered key topics, including the **mission of SMP**, **the impact of fraud**, **and the consequences of Medicare abuse**. Trevor also introduced the **three steps to preventing healthcare fraud**: **Protect**, **Detect**, **and Report**.

He emphasized the importance of **reviewing Medicare Summary Notices (MSN)** and **Explanation of Benefits (EOB)** to spot fraudulent charges. Seniors were advised to **treat their Medicare card like a credit card**, be cautious of **identity theft**, and remember that **Medicare does not make unsolicited calls or visits**. Trevor also explained how to **report suspected fraud** by calling the provider, gathering information, and contacting **SMP for assistance**. His presentation highlighted real fraud cases, including **false claims for medical supplies**, reminding everyone to stay vigilant and informed.




# Habitat Spring Cleanup —learn more and apply *March 6 at 10:00 am*
